Our New Hook Organ – Help Needed!

This is an exciting time for Christ Church in many ways as we begin a new chapter in our history, which began in 1826. As most of you know, last year Christ Church was about to launch a major campaign to restore and renovate our Church. When Jeffery suddenly resigned, the campaign had to be temporarily put on hold while the more pressing urgency of finding his replacement received the full attention of the vestry. One very critical component of our restoration, namely replacing our failing organ, has quietly continued to move forward getting closer to installation.

By way of background, because our 1961 organ was hastily built from various parts collected from different sources, its manner of creation limits in an extreme way the opportunity to procure replacement parts and components. Now, nearly fifty years later, the instrument is failing and by any standard, is one of the poorest performing instruments in use today. First, under the direction of Paul M. Walker, followed by John Whiteside, and now David and Elizabeth Norfrey, the organ has rapidly deteriorated and there is a strong possibility that the next time it fails, it cannot be repaired. Recognizing this rapid decline and the increasing difficulty of obtaining replacement parts for our organ, in 2005, after much study and deliberation, the building committee called TAM (Tradition and Mission), made the decision to include the cost of replacing the organ in the overall building renovation cost. John Whiteside, our Music Director and organist at the time, lead the organ committee to The Andover Organ Company located in Methuen, MA. The Andover Organ Co. specializes in rebuilding organs and has built its reputation doing so. At that time, there was a Hook, Opus 472, 1868 organ available that was ultimately recommended for purchase by our organ committee. Since TAM was moving forward at an increasingly accelerated pace in 2005, completing the exploratory architectural work as well as completing a thorough examination of our building by structural engineers, the vestry approved the Andover contract to purchase the 1868 Hook organ before it could be purchased by some other church. The Hook Organ Company was one of the premier organ builders in America in the 19th century. They built instruments that embodied superior tonal qualities that were intentionally designed to work well in American churches similar to Christ Church, having poor acoustic environments.

Although this organ is about half the cost of alternative organs considered by the Organ Committee, this refurbished organ will actually be superior to any of the alternatives. Our Opus 472, 1868 organ was originally installed in Grace Episcopal Church located in a suburb called Oak Park, in Chicago. Grace Episcopal Church was similar in size and style to Christ Church and shared with us some of the same architectural and acoustic principles. It represents an almost ideal match for our worship space, and when installed will look as though it was designed specifically for our sanctuary. It has every potential to serve the church with distinction for many generations.

Though the building program has temporarily been suspended, our contract with The Andover Organ Company remains in place as restoration of the pipe work began last summer. Work beginning on a new case and console began this January under the direction of Robert C. Newton who has obtained international recognition for his work in restoring Hook organs. Since each and every part of the organ will be totally refurbished, the rebuilt organ will be mechanically equal to any new organ, only better, because the restored pipes could never be emulated by totally new construction.

The beauty of the magnificent instrument, when installed, will in itself enhance our worship and add an unmatched dimension to our growing commitment to having a truly outstanding music ministry at Christ Church. God considers music a very high priority in celebrating his worship: I Chronicles 16:4-6, Ephesians 5:19. Under strong direction and leadership by the Norfreys, our music ministry, which includes an Adult Choir, Cherubim-Seraphim Choir, Praise Band and Handbell Choir, have flourished. The Hook organ, along with the recent acquisitions of a portative organ (small portable organ) and a Yamaha Grand Piano, allows Christ Church to have the necessary instrumentation to provide a diverse and rich music ministry to enhance our worship service, one of the four designated core values of our ministry at Christ Church.

The cost of the Hook organ installed is \$475,000. The contract required specific payments be made at periodic time intervals, which began in 2005. By the generosity of some members of our parish, \$100,000 has already been paid. However, of the \$375,000 balance, **\$125,000** remains to be paid in 2008. Although the organ is currently scheduled to be installed in January 2010, we are hopeful that the schedule could be accelerated if the building restoration project can be reactivated in the near future.



Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Christ Church's Annual Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 7 at 6 p.m. (dinner) with the business portion of the evening beginning at 6:45 p.m. At this gathering, we will elect five new Vestry members to replace outgoing members Betsy Boswell, Bill Carden, Maria Carlton, George Forschler, and, myself, Proal Heartwell. I have the privilege of chairing this year's Vestry Nominating Committee, whose task is to facilitate a spiritually-led search for the candidates who are best equipped to lead our congregation to be the Christ-centered, mission-focused church we desire.

I am writing you to consider if perhaps God is calling you to serve on the Nominating Committee. I would like this committee to have representatives from all four of our worship services, from each of the commissions, and from diverse ages and tenures at our church. Members of the committee will meet to prayerfully discuss potential candidates and ask those candidates to enter a process of discernment. Committee members will be required to attend one of three initial meetings at the church, tentatively scheduled for Sunday, March 9th (10:15 a. m.), Tuesday, March 11th (8:00 a. m.), and Thursday, March 13th (5:00 p.m.). Each potential Vestry candidate will be contacted by a committee member and asked to respond to three questions regarding his or her vision for Christ Church for the next three-five years. On Sunday, March 30th, the Nominating Committee will reconvene to formulate a slate of five candidates to put forward at the Annual Meeting.

To refresh your memory, the following motion, recorded in the minutes, was made at last year's Annual Meeting:

"Mike Fisher moved that item #3 of the By-Laws be amended to read as follows: The Nominating Committee shall present a slate of candidates equal to or greater than the number of vacancies [on the Vestry]. The motion was seconded by Justin Holcomb. As a rationale for his motion, Mr. Fisher explained that such a change would allow all persons expressing a desire or willingness to serve on the Vestry to be voted on by the larger body present at the Annual Meeting rather than having some persons eliminated from consideration by a selection process involving possibly 12 or even fewer members of the Parish. During discussion, the Parliamentarian suggested that the appropriate protocol to change the By-Laws would be for the Vestry to study the issue and that it be brought up again for a vote at the Annual Meeting of 2008. Mr. Fisher amended his motion to have the matter studied and re-introduced for a vote in May of 2008".

Therefore, there are no changes in effect for the process this year. A congregational vote will need to be taken in order to make any future changes. This means that the process this year must be consistent with the procedure followed for the past several years. However, per our By-Laws, nominations will be accepted from the floor.

Arts Community Update—Kate Daughdrill: Fellow

Something is happening involving the arts and community at Christ Church. Our hopes to build a creative community of people interested in the arts have been blessed in beautiful and surprising ways so far this year. From a monthly artist showcase and discussion series to painting classes full of parishioners, it seems that our desires to develop a vibrant arts ministry are beginning to take shape.

Since September, we have been hosting a monthly Makers Series that invites three prominent local artists to share their artwork and discuss their creative process with an audience of local community members. A local musician, writer/poet, and visual artist present their work from the stage to an audience of 60-80 people seated in small tables covered with unique, vintage tablecloths. The room is dotted with living room lamps and white lights, making for an intimate, creative ambiance in which to be together and experience the artists' work. The deep, authentic questions that audience members have been posing to the artists have been both provocative and inspiring. The conversations that have resulted about meaning, creativity, faith, and inspiration have been substantive and yet accessible. We have received much support and encouragement from the artists involved and the parishioners and community members in attendance as well as from the local arts publication, the Cville Weekly, and various leaders in the Charlottesville community.

In listening to others discuss their artwork, many of us have been inspired to delve even deeper into our own creative processes. People have been writing short

stories, painting the walls of their living rooms with crazy murals, and signing up for art classes. To facilitate more creation in community, we've worked with the McGuffey Art Center to organize a weekly abstract painting class for ten of us who are interested in learning more about the relationship between meaning, painting, and creativity. We're realizing that the process of painting reflects so much of the theology we believe!

Because so much is being created in our community, we are looking forward to developing ways to share our work with the wider community. We are planning an arts sleepover for late March during which anyone can participate in an "open mic" setting and share works of art they've created or others' art that is meaningful to them. We are also hoping to begin hanging art in Meade Hall so that parishioners can share what they have created with the wider community.

We were also very honored to have the acclaimed Christian rock musician, Derek Webb, play a concert at Christ Church in December. The show drew a large crowd of over 250 people on a Saturday night. Derek played and spoke about the provocative message of grace and addressed the value of art making as an organic reaction to the tremendous love and mercy of God.



TO YOURSELF

- ◇ Strive to pattern your own life and that of your family in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to others.
- ◇ Bear witness to Christ and devote yourself to the apostles' teachings, prayers, fellowship, and the breaking of bread.
- ◇ Strive to attend every vestry meeting and the church's annual meeting.
- ◇ Participate in an annual vestry retreat.
- ◇ Serve as a liaison to one of the commission groups.
- ◇ Complete commission work and assignments before the vestry meeting and make specific recommendations to the vestry.
- ◇ Be financially accountable for the budget accounts under your control.
- ◇ Make every effort to represent the vestry at church events and maintain contact with and become knowledgeable about the programs at Christ Church.
- ◇ Provide positive channels of communication between the congregation, clergy, and staff.
- ◇ When making decisions for the congregation; be prayerful and base judgment on what is good for the church as a whole and not following one's personal agenda.
- ◇ Be willing to give the time that is needed to the building of the body of Christ as a vestry member.
- ◇ Be regular in worship and show a commitment to strive toward the Biblical tithe.

TO THE RECTOR

- Assist the rector in planning the church year.
- Provide emotional, spiritual, and positive support and guidance.
- Serve as liaison with the congregation and provide feedback to the rector.
- Refer comments and problems needing a pastoral response.
- Agree to be Vestry Person of the Day (VPOD).
- Attend an annual Vestry retreat.

TO THE CONGREGATION

- ◇ Be a leader by example.
- ◇ Reconcile the church as to decisions made.
- ◇ Seek out opinion among the parishioners.
- ◇ Communicate with the congregation on the responsibilities of church membership or any other matters of concern.
- ◇ When necessary, and requested to do so, counsel with parishioners.
