




### ORGAN CORNER

The Organ Committee met on August 5th with Tom Keogh, one of our architects from Train and Partners Architects, and with Stan Binsted, President of R. E. Lee & Son, and his associate John Barrett. The committee had considerable discussion of the pros and cons of two potential locations for the organ's blower. The overwhelming advantage of locating the blower in the basement under the organ made that decision relatively easy even though the basement location is more expensive. The discussions with our architect and contractor led to the necessity of our committee making another important decision: do we, at this time, limit the basement excavation to accommodate only the small blower room for the organ or do we excavate the entire space under the chancel now in anticipation of future needs? Ultimately, the master plan for updating and remodeling includes a full basement under the Chancel to accommodate all the electrical, HVAC, and plumbing. The issue is two-fold; there is a large cost benefit to doing all the excavation at one time even though the initial cost of completing the excavation in one operation will add approximately 100,000 dollars to our current price, and secondly; Christ Church would have to endure only one period of approximately seven months without the use of the Chancel. Alternatively, returning at a later time to complete the excavation will greatly escalate the cost in both dollars and time that we will have to vacate the Chancel. For example utilizing the two phase approach will require two additional temporary dust walls being erected, one to protect the new organ and one to completely separate the nave from the Chancel. Each dust wall costs approximately 15,000 dollars. Thus, performing all the excavation before the organ is installed will require only one dust wall, a saving of approximately 30,000 dollars before the work even begins. The committee requested that our architect and contractor, as quickly as possible, provide an accurate cost estimate for the full excavation compared to the cost of simply excavating for the blower room. The committee, armed with an accurate cost estimate, will next meet on August 23rd to consider this option. The final step in this process will be the committee's recommendation of the most cost effective and least disruptive approach for preparing the Chancel for installation of our new organ to the Vestry in late August. The Vestry will have to make the final decision as to what we will contract R. E. Lee to accomplish in the Chancel prior to the installation of the organ. As for the organ itself, Dan Olson, President of the Andover Organ Company, has apprised us that the organ construction and restoration will be fully completed this December and ready for installation in January 2011. This is obviously an exciting time in the life of this long process; the contract was signed and the first payment of ten thousand dollars in April 2005 and, finally, we are preparing for its installation. Stay tuned, we should have an actual time line for the organ's installation by the next Messenger.


