A WORD FROM PAUL WALKER

Last month I had the privilege of traveling to Haiti with Bishop Shannon Johnston and 2 others from our Diocese. We were there at the invitation of The Right Reverend Jean Zache Duracin, the Bishop of Haiti, to meet with church leaders, assess the post earthquake situation, and witness the work of the Episcopal Church in that impoverished country.

The Diocese of Haiti is part of Province 2 of the Episcopal Church in the United States of America. They are one of the largest and poorest dioceses of our church; we are one of the largest and wealthiest. We hoped that the visit would enable us to provide some material support for the people of Haiti, as well as establish an ongoing relationship with our brothers and sisters in Christ living in that part of our Communion.

I did not know what to expect. Christie and I lived in Haiti for 5 months – but that was 22 years ago! The door on our experience had been closed for quite some time; I wasn't sure what I would find as the door opened up again.

What I found was the presence of God working powerfully through the Episcopal Church in Haiti! Bishop Duracin is a gracious, yet strong leader; the clergy we met with were organized and effective. They are mobilized to bring both material and spiritual help to the people of Haiti. The Episcopal Church operates over 250 schools throughout the country, providing meals, uniforms and education to countless children. In the face of preposterous difficulty, our fellow believers exhibit resilience, joy, and trust in the goodness of God. We were deeply distressed by their suffering, but profoundly encouraged by their witness to Jesus Christ.

I look forward to exploring a continuing partnership with a parish and school in Haiti. We at Christ Church surely have much to give our friends in Haiti materially, and even more to receive spiritually.

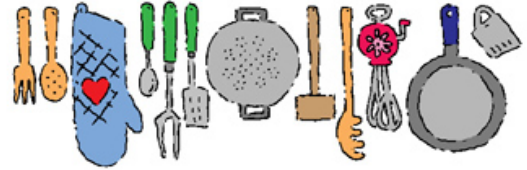
### November 7th—UTO Sunday

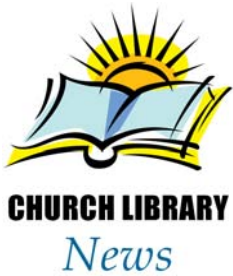

## Organ Update

The organ committee is scheduled to meet November 3rd to review and approve the final drawings for the renovation of the chancel. Our architects, Train and Partners Architects, have worked diligently with the organ committee to address every possible configuration and placement of the essential components of the chancel for conducting the wide spectrum of worship services in limited space. As noted in a previous Messenger, our newly reconstructed Hook organ, once installed, will occupy approximately one third of our current chancel space; thus, the difficult task of prioritizing every usable inch of remaining space. Train and Partners Architects in collaboration with the organ committee have done a remarkable job in accomplishing this task.



Plans and the contract for the core drilling project discussed in last month's Messenger have been approved and work will begin Thursday October 28th. This work will take approximately one week at the most and the results will determine the size and extent of the excavation under the chancel. Once we have this critical information coupled with the detailed construction drawings from our architects, our contractor, R.E. Lee, will be able to provide a finite budget for the full renovation. At this point, the vestry, assuming the budget comes in relatively close to the approximated budget provided by R.E. Lee, will approve the budget and sign the contract. Work is scheduled to begin during the first week in January.

Since not everyone may be familiar with the history of our new organ it may be of interest to once again revisit the background of our purchase. This three manual 27 stop E. and G.G. Hook, Opus 472 - 1868 organ was originally built for Grace Episcopal Church located in Chicago. It remained there until 1902 when it was moved to another Grace Episcopal Church in Oak Park, a suburb of Chicago. It remained there until 1922 when it was moved back to Chicago to Ludmilla's Roman Catholic Church where it was electrified and placed in chambers. In 1988 Ludmilla's merged with another church and the building and organ were put up for sale. The Andover Organ Company purchased the organ and placed it in storage at Andover. Only the wind chest and pipes survived from the original 1868 organ. Christ Church, on the strong recommendation of John Whiteside our Director of Music in 2005, signed a contract with The Andover Organ Company to reconstruct and adapt the Opus 472 Hook to Christ Church. This endeavor involved building new case work, new action, new structure, new wind system, and tonal additions has taken five years and will be complete Nov. 6, 2010. Andover, located in Lawrence, MA, has scheduled an open house on Nov. 6, 2010 to view and hear a recital on our new organ. Paul Music Walker will attend the open house.

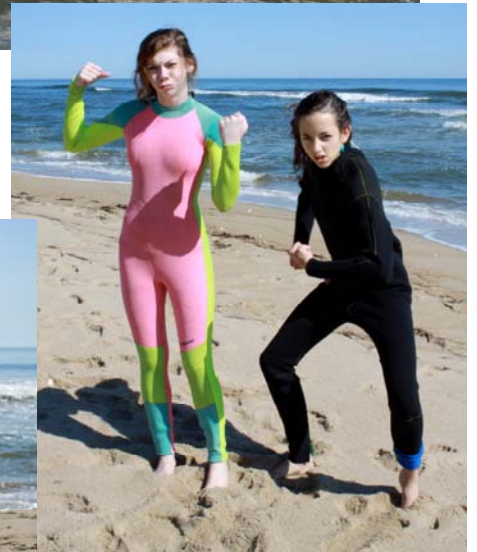

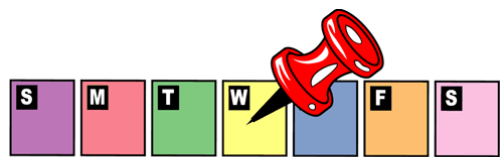
