A Message from Dave Johnson

Dear Friends,

As Paul Walker has communicated many times over the past several years, even though we do not have a “mission statement” per se at Christ Church our “mission” is three-fold: preach the Gospel, love people, and trust the Holy Spirit to change lives. When it comes to the second item, loving people, part of what we try to do in everything we do at Christ Church—from Sunday services to children’s chapel to Sunday School to the choirs to the youth groups to 20’s/30’s gatherings to answering the phone, everything—is to help people feel welcome. Welcoming one another, whether we’re new to Christ Church or have been coming for decades, is a fundamental response to what we preach about at Christ Church every week: the grace of God.

Throughout His earthly ministry Jesus gave grace to people by welcoming them. He welcomed people whom the stuffy religious types refused to welcome—especially tax collectors, pagans, notorious sinners, Roman soldiers, the mentally ill, and little kids. Jesus also welcomed the outcasts and outsiders, people like the Samaritan woman at the well and the lepers who had to live alone outside of town and call out, “Unclean! Unclean!” in order to keep others away from them. Even as He was dying on the cross Jesus welcomed the penitent thief who was crucified at His side, assuring him, “Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise” (Luke 23:43).

And Jesus especially welcomes the weary, regardless of the cause of the weariness—work-related stress or financial difficulties or family dysfunction or peer pressure or personal anxiety or guilt or anything else. Jesus’ welcoming words to the weary are among the “comfortable words” that we often say at Sunday services after the confession and absolution: “Come to me, all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11:28).

One of my favorite things about serving and worshipping with you at Christ Church is the welcoming atmosphere that continues to grow here. Expressions of welcome—from smiles to hugs to handshakes to high fives—all express gracious welcome to one another in response to the gracious welcome Jesus always gives us. Toward the end of his Letter to the Romans Paul put it this way: “Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God” (Romans 15:7). Regardless of whether you are new to Christ Church or have been here for decades, regardless of what is going on in your life, regardless of what may be causing you weariness, we hope that you will always feel warmly welcomed to Christ Church ☺.

We can say with certainty that the restoration and installation of Andover Opus 472 has been a huge success.

Special Summer Visitors



Children's Chapel & Vacation Bible School


