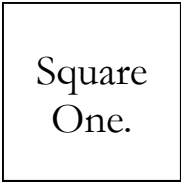

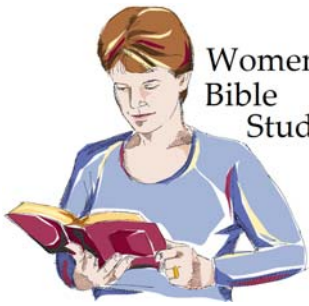

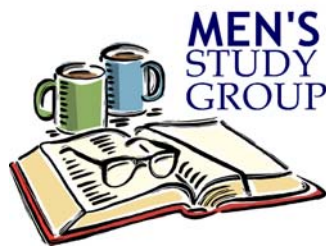
Women's Bible Study

We are now worshipping in Meade Hall. It's a beautiful worship space and we are so happy to have it!

The pews are on vacation! Some are at the spa getting some TLC. This allows our flooring contractor to work on leveling out the existing floor, doing some joist repairs and installing new oak flooring over the existing floor. We hope to be back in the Sanctuary sometime in September.

The old organ pipe room is being converted into a much needed work room and is progressing nicely. At this writing, the asbestos abatement in the crawl space under the church continues. The hope is that the work will be finished the week of August

If you haven't been at Church in awhile, you won't recognize the place! In a nutshell, here's the

1st. Some necessary electrical work will be completed shortly thereafter and then...let the jack-hammering begin! The "big dig" should start the week of August 8th. Once the digging is done, a room for the organ blower goes in and another larger room for mechanicals gets completed. Then a new chancel floor is installed, the communion rail will be put in place and our beautiful new pulpit will be unveiled too. The wall is scheduled to come down in late December and the organ installation (which will take 8 weeks+) will begin hopefully in mid January.

Please keep all of the workmen in your prayers during this renovation and also pray that we can finish ahead of schedule. Wouldn't that be nice?

20 NOLAven: The New Orleans Mission Trip

Greetings Christ Church!

As the last few weeks of summer pass by, we thought it appropriate to update the parish on the youth group's summer activities, particularly our mission trip to New Orleans. At 7am on Sunday, June 26, a bleary-eyed and half-asleep group of 16 girls, 5 boys and four leaders assembled in the Christ Church parking lot to embark on an unforgettable journey to the Pelican State. Piling into two 12-passenger vans and a mini-van, we set off on what would be a two-day trip, traveling through six states with an overnight stay in the lovely town of Eutaw, Alabama. We arrived in New Orleans on Monday afternoon in the midst of a torrential downpour but were nonetheless greeted by a spirited and welcoming group of staff members from Son Servants, the terrific organizers of our trip. Later in the evening, we were



joined by youth groups from Ft. Myers, Florida; Jeffersonville, Indiana; Longmont, Colorado; and Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. Our home for the week was Woodland Presbyterian church, an extremely gracious congregation who year-after-year opens their doors to Son Servants campers, providing ample floor space for blow-up mattresses and delicious dinners each and every night.

On Tuesday morning, we were awakened by Son Servants Summer Staffers singing (or trying to sing) Enrique Iglesias' *I Can be your Hero* and after a delicious breakfast and a quiet time, were sent out into the city to do God's work and spread His love. The worksites varied from inner-city schools to city parks to abandoned mental health hospitals. Under the direction of local volunteer coordinators, pastors and contractors, we were able to experience a wide

variety of ways in which God uses us to love and care for others. One work group assisted a local pastor in collecting donated furniture from the New Orleans Naval Base and organizing it for its distribution to local families who still lacked furnishings from the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina. Another group worked at the Thompson Day Shelter preparing jambalaya for 200 with some wonderful nuns and also had the chance to sort, pack, and weigh boxes at the Second Harvest Food Bank. Still others helped to paint inner-city schools whose basic upkeep had been neglected for years. These were but a few of the numerous projects in which our kids participated, yet each one was fulfilling and enlightening in its own way. (continued)



Each afternoon, at the conclusion of our workday, we were given several hours of free time before dinner, in which we could shower, hang out, and play endless games of Nertz. After dinner came the evening meetings, in which God was always imminent. They took place in the church's activity center and included songs of praise, games and a message centered on the trip's theme of the week: Simple. We then reconvened as a youth group for Family Time, in which we discussed the day's events, our experiences and the ways in which we saw God at work.



Thursday afternoon we were given the afternoon off and as a church, we ventured into the French Quarter where we descended upon beignets and cafe au laits at the famous Cafe du Monde. Fat and happy, we split into two groups and some of us saw an illuminating Imax movie about Hurricane Katrina's impact on the wetlands while the others merrily explored the French Quarter.



Friday evening marked the end of our last day of work and our final meeting before coming home. As such, students were given the opportunity to share their most meaningful experiences of the week, yielding some incredible moments. The week was then concluded with a ceremonial foot-washing, an event so personal and vulnerable that it made the Holy Spirit's presence palpable. After the ceremony, hugs and Facebook names were exchanged and goodbyes were said as we all headed to bed in expectation of an early departure the following morning.

Apart from the longest day of driving ever experienced in the history of mankind (a whopping 15-hour trip to Bristol, TN), the trip home was uneventful. The hours were passed reminiscing about the events of the week and playing numerous games of rhyme-time, concentration and twenty questions. One week and eight hours after our departure, we arrived back in the Christ Church parking lot to the site of friends and family. We are so thankful for all of the prayers offered on our behalf and sincerely appreciate the support that this parish has given us, without which, this trip would not have been possible. If you have not yet seen our NOLA bulletin board, there are dozens of pictures chronicling our trip posted right outside Meade Hall. Thank you again for all of your support and we look forward to representing Christ Church again in the near future.
