It will arrive in 2 trucks and take 2 days to unload. We will block off 2nd Street and carry the parts in through the 2nd Street door. We will store the organ in the Donovan room and on the Meade Hall stage. So don't be surprised by our 16 ton visitor who is coming to make it's permanent home in the chancel of our old and wonderful Church! As you may know, renovation of the chancel will begin in early July; organ installation should be completed by Easter 2012.

You also know that Paul Music Walker will finish his ministry here at Christ Church in June. We are having a final **Choral Evensong service on Sunday, June 5th at 5pm, followed by a reception to honor Paul and Diane.** Paul's service at Christ Church has been invaluable and we are saddened to lose him. Yet, we do rejoice in the Walker's call to Notre Dame. Please do plan to attend Paul's final Evensong and help send them off in style at the reception to follow.

On that note (no pun intended), **I am thrilled to announce that we have hired Kerry Beaumont as our new Director of Music.** Kerry is from England, born in Cambridge, and is currently the Director of Music at Coventry Cathedral. 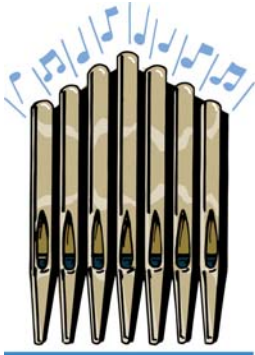
20's-30's – Two Events Coming Your Way!

Chancel Update



We have been behind the scenes, preparing for the delivery of our (new to us) organ! It is coming in 2 moving vans over 2 days, May 2nd and 3rd. We have paid to reserve parking spots along 2nd Street, so the organ can be unloaded and then safely stored in our Donovan Room and on our stage.

ORGAN CORNER

The removal of our old organ and the chancel renovations will begin on Tuesday, July 5th. We believe by Sunday, July 10th, there will be a construction wall (complete with a viewing window) in place and the many pieces that are going to be restored and used in our newly renovated chancel will be out of the building under transformation.

The Memorial Garden renovation continues. The air handler has been removed and a new unit has been installed on the East Tower. Landscaping and gate and fence installation in the garden will begin shortly.

George MacDonald grew up in Scotland with strong Evangelical influences, went into the ministry and eventually became a very prolific writer. His adult books reflect his deep faith and trust that God permeates all of life and desires for us to have a relationship with Him. He believed deeply that God did indeed create the whole universe and through it desires our close walk with Him. P.S. Have a wonderful reading summer (at the beach!). See you in the fall?

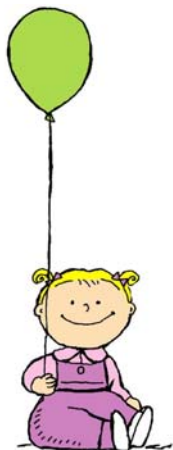

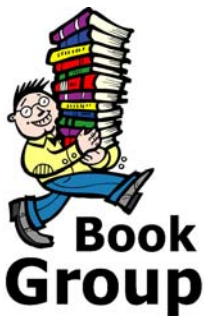

Spring Break Nicaragua Mission Trip

In a really beautiful picture of the church (in a broader sense) working together, Christ Church was invited to come on Trinity Presbyterian Church's Spring Break mission trip to Granada, Nicaragua this year. We were a merry crew of six, and we got to come alongside ministries that were already happening in the community to ease the burden for workers, and to support, encourage, and learn from them. It is truly a blessing to share life with folks who are in such different situations than we are used to in America. We got to lead a children's Sunday School class (where Jane shared a story of God's work in her life... in Spanish!), we helped clean and spent time with residents at a Nursing Home, we led a couple of Vacation Bible School-like sessions for kids in the barrio, we helped feed folks who live and work at the town dump, we learned to make piñatas with special needs adults, we helped kids with homework at a Catholic Girls' orphanage, and we even had the chance to take a 20k bike ride up a volcano and swim in the laguna which now resides inside. We all came to love beans and rice, and we will not soon forget the sound of the 'traca traca's (a kids' toy which makes a continual clacking noise) which reverberated throughout the country. It is always an encouragement to see that Jesus is the same everywhere- in a third-world country or a first, in a Spanish-speaking town or an English one, in a Presbyterian church or an Episcopal one.
